Sveriges Riksbank invites submissions to its **annual research conference**. This year's focus will be on **Networks, Inflation, and Monetary Policy Transmission**. The conference will take place at the Riksbank in Stockholm on 1 & 2 October 2026.

Recent research highlights the importance of **production, trade, and financial networks** for shock propagation, inflation dynamics, and monetary policy transmission. The conference aims to bring together leading academics and policymakers to explore these themes at the frontier of research and policy.

We are delighted to announce that **Vasco Carvalho** (University of Cambridge) and **Tommaso Monacelli** (Bocconi University) will deliver keynote speeches.

We encourage submissions of both theoretical and empirical work on topics such as:

- Production networks and supply chains as drivers of inflation dynamics.
- Trade networks and the cross-border transmission of monetary policy.
- Financial linkages and the transmission of shocks.
- Novel methodologies for identifying and quantifying network structures in the economy.
- Policy implications of network-based propagation for central banks.
